Dear Chair Baldwin, Ranking Member Capito, Chair Aderholt, and Ranking Member DeLauro:

The undersigned organizations are concerned about fiscal year 2024 funding for the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS), also known as AmeriCorps. While we understand that Congress faces challenging budget decisions as a result of the debt deal, we hope you will ultimately provide a robust appropriation for CNCS in FY24 so that communities can continue to count on AmeriCorps for help where it's needed most.

The House and Senate have proposed funding levels for AmeriCorps that are vastly different. The House Labor-HHS Appropriations bill cuts the service agency's budget by 50%—the lowest level in nearly three decades. It also eliminates all funding for AmeriCorps education awards, undermining a fundamental commitment that if you serve in AmeriCorps, you will earn money to help pay for college or to pay back student loans. The House proposal would eliminate tens of thousands of AmeriCorps positions and resources that our communities cannot afford to lose.

While the Senate bill is comparatively a step in the right direction, it still falls short of what is needed to fund planned increases to the AmeriCorps member living allowances and maintain AmeriCorps' footprint across the country. CNCS will be increasing living allowances in FY24, a strategic investment that was endorsed by a sizable, bipartisan group of senators and representatives earlier this year. But without additional investment by Congress, it would trigger a significant cut in awarded positions and a reduction in services that AmeriCorps members provide.

Since 1993, AmeriCorps has deployed more than 1.25 million Americans to the local front lines of our nation's most immediate and critical issues. Every day, dedicated AmeriCorps members and AmeriCorps Seniors respond to natural disasters, tutoring students, combatting hunger and homelessness, fighting the opioid epidemic, helping seniors live independently, supporting veterans and military families, and far more.

AmeriCorps is one of the federal government's best investments. AmeriCorps service members offer community organizations the people power they need to solve urgent local challenges – and AmeriCorps grants are matched by funds from private, philanthropic, and local sources, increasing the impact of the

taxpayer dollars. This high-impact and efficient public-private partnership yields more than \$17 in benefits for every \$1 invested by Congress.

For FY24 appropriations, we hope you will pledge to reject any cuts and support a robust investment that leverages AmeriCorps' impact and sustains our current corps size. Thank you for your leadership in Congress.
